







5. DESCRIPTIONS OF THE FCI CLASS EXERCISE SIGNS










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








- If it is not otherwise stated in the description of the sign, the general performance guidelines in § 4 should be followed.
- The concerning exercise area of the sign is listed in the description of every sign (A, B, C or D, see also § 4.3. Exercise area).
- Note: All exercises can be performed with the dog on the left side or the right side of the handler (exceptions: 417 = only left side, 418 = only right side).
- Changes to another heelingside are written down in the description of the concerning sign. The course layout informs whether the dog should be on the left or the right side at the start.
- Fluent exercises from 1 point signs (105-113) can also be performed in slow pace or fast pace. The sign before the fluent 1 point signs decides in which pace the exercise is performed in.

SIGN	DESCRIPTION
	START (A) The dog sits at the handler's left or right side, as instructed in the drawing of the course. When completed, the team moves forward.
	FINISH (A) The course is finished when the team has passed this sign. The team leaves the competition area at a normal pace.








5.1. 1 point signs

SIGN	DESCRIPTION
	101 DOWN (A) The handler stops and the dog lies down directly beside the handler. The dog stays down until the team moves forward.
	102 STOP, DOWN (A) The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. After that the dog is directed to a down position. The dog stays down until the team moves forward.
	103 STOP, WALK AROUND (A) The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. While the dog remains sitting, the handler walks forward around the dog, back to the side of the dog, and makes a stop. The dog remains sitting until the team moves forward.
	104 STOP, DOWN, WALK AROUND (A) The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. After that the dog is directed to a down position. While the dog remains lying, the handler walks forward around the dog, back to the side of the dog, and makes a stop. The dog stays down until the team moves forward.








	<p>105 ABOUT TURN RIGHT (B) Together the team does a tight 180° turn to the right and moves in the opposite direction.</p>
	<p>106 ABOUT TURN LEFT (B) Together the team does a tight 180° turn to the left and moves in the opposite direction.</p>
	<p>107 LOOP RIGHT (B) Together the team does a tight turn to the right (Loop) crossing the original path. The angle of the turn has to be between 180° and 270°.</p>
	<p>108 LOOP LEFT (B) Together the team does a tight turn to the left (Loop) crossing the original path. The angle of the turn has to be between 180° and 270°.</p>
	<p>109 270° RIGHT (B) Together the team does a tight 270° turn to the right. The new direction is 90° left to the original path.</p>
	<p>110 270° LEFT (B) Together the team does a tight 270° turn to the left. The new direction is 90° right to the original path.</p>
	<p>111 360° RIGHT (A) Together the team does a tight 360° turn to the right. The team keeps the original direction.</p>
	<p>112 360° LEFT (A) Together the team does a tight 360° turn to the left. The team keeps the original direction.</p>
	<p>113 TURN AROUND DOG BEHIND (B) The handler does an about turn to the side, where the dog is, while the dog turns to the side, where the handler is. The dog is moving around behind the handler and back to its initial heel position to continue moving with the handler in the opposite direction.</p>

	<p>114 STOP, 90° RIGHT TURN, STOP (B) The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. The handler does a 90° turn to the right on the spot and stops. The dog moves simultaneously with the handler and resumes a sit when the handler stops. The dog remains sitting until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>115 STOP, 90° LEFT TURN, STOP (B) The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. The handler does a 90° turn to the left on the spot and stops. The dog moves simultaneously with the handler and resumes a sit when the handler stops. The dog remains sitting until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>116 SLOW PACE (A) The team must slow down noticeably. The slow pace must be kept, until a sign shows a new pace or the team has reached the finish sign.</p>
	<p>117 RUN (A) The team must speed up noticeably. The fast pace must be kept, until a sign shows a new pace or the team has reached the finish sign.</p>
	<p>118 NORMAL PACE (A) The team returns to normal pace.</p>
	<p>119 SPIRAL RIGHT (B) Three cones are placed in a straight line with spaces between them of 1.5 to 2 m. The team must turn to the right to move around each of the cones.</p>
	<p>120 SPIRAL LEFT (B) Three cones are placed in a straight line with spaces between them of 1.5 to 2 m. The team must turn to the left to move around each of the cones.</p>
	<p>121 SINGLE SLALOM (B) Four cones are placed in a straight line with spaces between them of 1.5 to 2 m. The team must enter the exercise with the first cone on its left and weaves through the four cones.</p>
	<p>122 DOUBLE SLALOM (B) Four cones are placed in a straight line with spaces between them of 1.5 to 2 m. The team must enter the exercise with the first cone on its left, weaves through the four cones, rounds the end cone and weaves back.</p>













SIGN	DESCRIPTION
	<p>201 2 x TURN AROUND DOG BEHIND (A)</p> <p>The handler does an about turn to the side, where the dog is, while the dog turns to the side, where the handler is. The dog is moving around behind the handler and back to its initial heel position to continue moving with the handler in the opposite direction. After 2 or 3 steps the handler does again an about turn to the side, where the dog is, while the dog turns again to the side, where the handler is. The dog is moving again around behind the handler back to its initial heel position to continue moving with the handler in the same direction as before the exercise.</p>
	<p>202 DOUBLE 180° TURN, RIGHT THEN LEFT (A)</p> <p>Together the team does a tight 180° turn to the right and moves in the opposite direction. After 2 or 3 steps the team does together a tight 180° turn to the left and moves in the same direction as before the exercise.</p>
	<p>203 DOUBLE 180° TURN, LEFT THEN RIGHT (A)</p> <p>Together the team does a tight 180° turn to the left and moves in the opposite direction. After 2 or 3 steps the team does together a tight 180° turn to the right and moves in the same direction as before the exercise.</p>
	<p>204 STOP, DOWN, SIT (A)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. After that the dog is directed to a down position, followed by a sit position. The dog remains sitting until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>205 STOP, STAND (A)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. After that the dog is directed to a stand position. The dog remains standing until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>206 STOP, STAND, SIT (A)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. After that the dog is directed to a stand position, followed by a sit position. The dog remains sitting until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>207 STOP, STAND, DOWN (A)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. After that the dog is directed to a stand position, followed by a down position. The dog stays down until the team moves forward.</p>









	<p>208 STOP, STAND, WALK AROUND (A)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. After that the dog is directed to a stand position. While the dog remains standing, the handler walks forward around the dog, back to the side of the dog, and makes a stop. The dog remains standing until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>209 STOP, CALL FRONT STOP, RIGHT TO LEFT, STOP (A)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. After that the dog is directed to sit in front of the handler. The dog is then directed to move to the handler's right and behind the handler to the left side. The dog sits before the team moves forward. Return to left handling.</p>
	<p>210 STOP, CALL FRONT STOP, LEFT TO LEFT, STOP (A)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. After that the dog is directed to sit in front of the handler. The dog is then directed to move directly to the handler's left side. The dog sits before the team moves forward. Return to left handling.</p>
	<p>211 STOP, 1 STEP FORWARD, 90° RIGHT TURN 1 STEP, CALL, STOP (B)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. The dog remains sitting while the handler takes one step forward, stops and thereafter does a 90° turn to the right, again takes one step in the new direction and again stops. The step to the right can either be taken directly or the handler can turn on the spot and then take the step. After that the dog is called to sit at the handler's side (no change of the heeling side). The dog remains sitting until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>212 STOP, 1 STEP FORWARD, 90° LEFT TURN 1 STEP, CALL, STOP (B)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. The dog remains sitting while the handler takes one step forward, stops and thereafter does a 90° turn to the left, again takes one step in the new direction and again stops. The step to the left can either be taken directly or the handler can turn on the spot and then take the step. After that the dog is called to sit at the handler's side (no change of the heeling side). The dog remains sitting until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>213 STOP, 180° RIGHT TURN, FORWARD (B)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. Together the team does a tight 180° turn to the right on the spot and continues forward, in the opposite direction.</p>
	<p>214 STOP, 180° LEFT TURN, FORWARD (B)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. Together the team does a tight 180° turn to the left on the spot and continues forward, in the opposite direction.</p>
	<p>215 STOP, 180° RIGHT TURN, STOP (B)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. Together the team does a tight 180° turn to the right on the spot, stops and the dog is directed to a sit position. The dog remains sitting until the team moves forward.</p>


	<p>216 STOP, 180° LEFT TURN, STOP (B)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. Together the team does a tight 180° turn to the left on the spot, stops and the dog is directed to a sit position. The dog remains sitting until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>217 STOP, 90° RIGHT TURN 1 STEP, STOP (B)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. The handler does a 90° turn to the right on the spot, takes one step and stops. The step can either be taken directly or the handler can turn on the spot and then take the step. The dog moves simultaneously with the handler and resumes a sit when the handler stops. The dog remains sitting until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>218 STOP, 90° LEFT TURN 1 STEP, STOP (B)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. The handler does a 90° turn to the left on the spot, takes one step and stops. The step can either be taken directly or the handler can turn on the spot and then take the step. The dog moves simultaneously with the handler and resumes a sit when the handler stops. The dog remains sitting until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>219 STOP, 1 STEP STAND, 2 STEPS STOP, 3 STEPS DOWN (A)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. After that the handler takes one step forward and stops. The dog moves simultaneously with the handler and resumes a stand when the handler stops. The handler then takes two steps forward and stops. The dog moves simultaneously with the handler and resumes a sit when the handler stops. Thereafter the handler takes three steps forward and stops. The dog moves simultaneously with the handler and resumes a down when the handler stops. The dog stays down until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>220 SPIN (A)</p> <p>While the team is moving, the dog spins a circle forward, alongside and in the direction away from the handler.</p>
	<p>221 DISTRACTIONS (B)</p> <p>Two cones are placed 2.5 to 3 m apart. The distance between the other two markings (distractions) is 1.5 to 2 m. The team must enter the exercise as decided by the judge and performs a complete figure 8 around the cones, crossing the line between the distractions three times. Toys, treats or both may be used as distractions.</p>
	<p>222 SEND OVER JUMP (D)</p> <p>The dog is sent over the jump at the earliest next to the sign that is two meters before the jump. At the same time the handler continues alongside the jump. The handler may increase the pace to catch up with the dog.</p>

	<p>306 CALL FRONT STOP, 1 STEP BACK STAND, 2 STEPS BACK STOP, 3 STEPS BACK DOWN (A) The handler stops and the dog is directed to sit in front of the handler. After that the handler takes one step backwards and stops. The dog moves simultaneously with the handler and resumes a stand in front of the handler when the handler stops. The handler then takes two steps backwards and stops. The dog moves simultaneously with the handler and resumes a sit in front of the handler when the handler stops. Thereafter the handler takes three steps backwards and stops. The dog moves simultaneously with the handler and resumes a down in front of the handler when the handler stops. 



	<p>307 STAND, 180° RIGHT TURN, STAND (B)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog stands beside the handler. Together the team does a tight 180° turn to the right on the spot, stops and the dog is directed to a stand position. The dog remains standing until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>308 STAND, 180° LEFT TURN, STAND (B)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog stands beside the handler. Together the team does a tight 180° turn to the left on the spot, stops and the dog is directed to a stand position. The dog remains standing until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>309 STAND, CIRCLE AROUND HANDLER, STAND (A)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog stands beside the handler. After that the handler directs the dog to circle forward around the handler. 	<p>310 TURN TOWARD (B)</p> <p>While moving, the team does a tight and simultaneous 180° turn toward each other and continues in the opposite direction. The heeling side is changed.</p>

	<p>312 SIDE SHIFT BETWEEN LEGS (A)</p> <p>The dog makes a side shift between the handler's legs. The handler may stop when the dog performs the exercise. The handler is allowed to lift a leg to make the side shift fluently. The heeling side is changed.</p>
	<p>313 BOTH ABOUT TURN RIGHT (B)</p> <p>While moving, both, the handler and the dog itself, do a tight and simultaneous 180° turn to the right and continue in the opposite direction. The heeling side is changed.</p>






	<p>315 STOP, SIDE SHIFT BEHIND, STOP (A)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. After that the dog is directed to make a side shift behind the handler and to resume a sit on the other side. The dog is not allowed to spin to make the shift. When completed, the team moves forward. The heeling side is changed.</p>
	<p>316 STOP, SIDE SHIFT IN FRONT, STOP (A)</p> <p>The handler stops and the dog sits beside the handler. After that the dog is directed to make a side shift in front of the handler and to resume a sit on the other side. The dog must spin to make the shift. When completed, the team moves forward. The heeling side is changed.</p>
	<p>317 MOVING STAND, WALK AROUND (A)</p> <p>While moving, the dog is directed to a stand position and the handler, without pausing, walks forward, then around the dog, back to the side of the dog and makes a stop. The dog remains standing until the team moves forward.</p>
	<p>318 MOVING DOWN, WALK AROUND (A)</p> <p>While moving, the dog is directed to a down position and the handler, without pausing, walks forward, then around the dog, back to the side of the dog and makes a stop. The dog stays down until the team moves forward.</p>

The jumps can be in a straight line or in an angle up to 90°, but they must be at minimum four meters apart from each other. At the same time the handler continues alongside the jumps. After the two jumps the handler directs the dog to heel. The handler can call his dog to heel between the jumps and may increase the pace to catch up with his dog.</p>
	<p>321 TURN AROUND, RECALL (B)</p> <p>This sign can only be used after exercises 319, 408 and 409, instead of a recall cone. The handler stops, turns around and recalls the dog. The dog is directed to go to the left heel position (without a sit). When reached, the team moves forward. Return to left handling.</p>
	<p>322 TURN AROUND, RECALL FRONT STOP, RIGHT TO LEFT, STOP (B)</p> <p>This sign can only be used after exercises 319, 408 and 409, instead of a recall cone. The handler stops, turns around and recalls the dog. The dog is directed to sit in front of the handler. The dog is then directed to move to the handler's right and behind the handler to the left side. The dog sits before the team moves forward. Return to left handling.</p>

	<p>408 MOVING SIT, WALK FORWARD (A) While moving, the dog is directed to a sit position and the handler, without pausing and without his dog, walks forward either to the recall cone and recalls the dog (no change of the heeling side) or to the recall sign and follows the instructions on the recall sign. If no additional recall sign is placed, the recall cone and the recall itself are part of this exercise.</p>

Thereafter the dog is recalled to the handler's left side. The dog sits before the team moves forward. Return to left handling.</p>
